The medical office building will house Jackson Heart and Vascular Center, LLC., the Jackson Heart Clinic, P.A. office, and medical clinics. The cardiovascular ambulatory surgery center will be the second one built in Mississippi.

Jackson Heart Clinic was established in 1973 by Drs. James C. Hays and James L. Crosthwait. Along with Dr. Quinton H. Dickerson, these three physicians were instrumental in the formation of the Mississippi Heart and Vascular Institute and the opening of the cardiac catheterization laboratory at St. Dominic's Hospital.

The clinic currently has three locations in the Greater Jackson area and employs over 100 personnel including nurses, medical technicians, and administration. It is also one of the largest cardiology groups in the state of Mississippi, consisting of board-certified cardiologists that cover all realms of specialties such as general and invasive cardiology, peripheral artery disease, and electrophysiology. The new facility is set to be completed Spring 2023.
